



Intermediate Activities

Recognizing Coin Values

Materials: coins, handout

Review each coin value separately. "A penny is one cent."



"A nickel is five cents," and so on.



Lay out coins in a 5 by 4 matrix. Say, "I spy 1 cent." Select a child to take one cent.



Continue to name different coin values, and choose different children to take coins, until all coins are gone.

Next, introduce the game, Roll a Coin.




Roll the coin die, then cover the coin on the handout.


















Continue until all coins on the handout are covered. For an extra challenge have children play roll and cover the coin value.

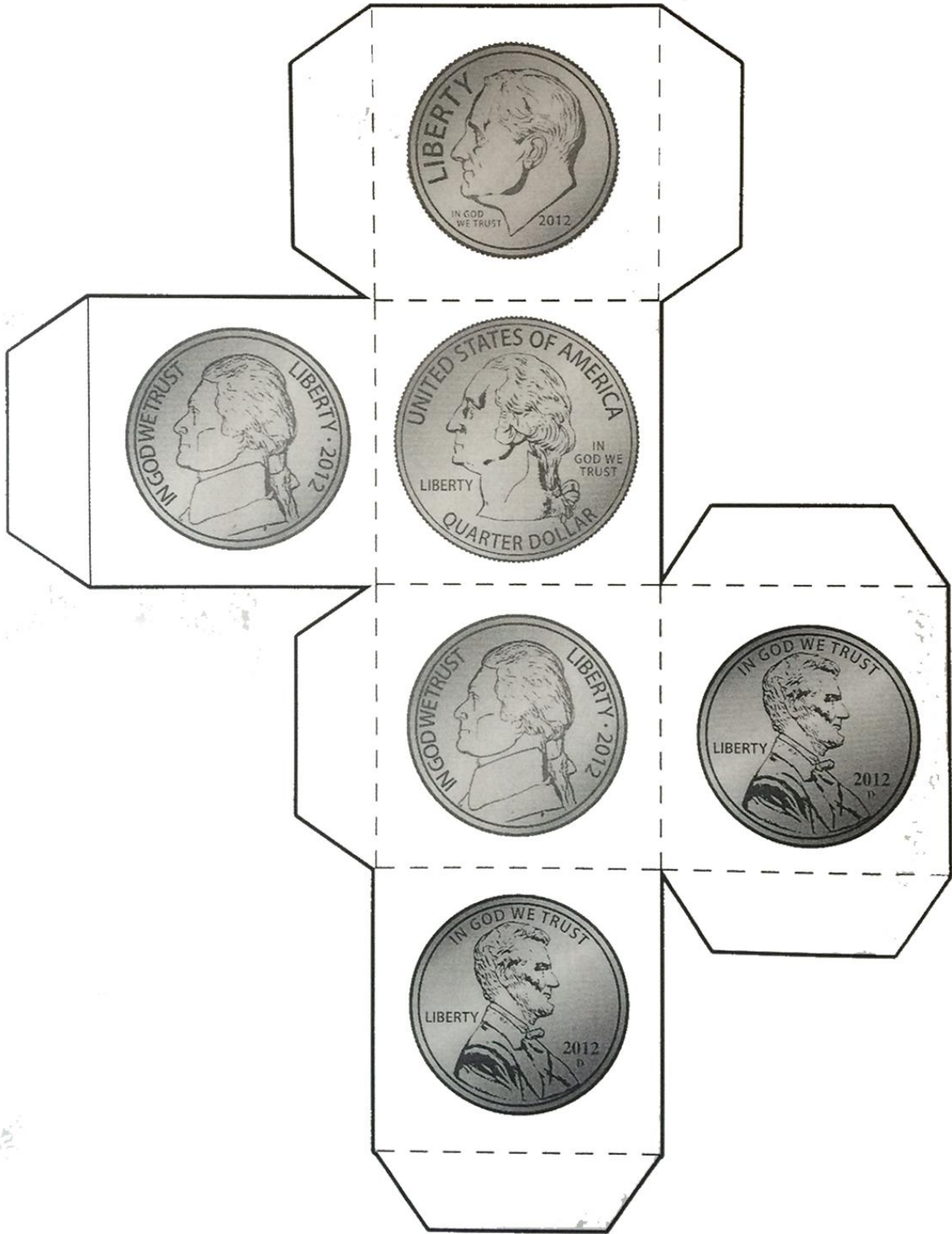


Directions: Roll the Coin die, then cover the coin with the coin you roll.

Materials: coins, handout

Show me with your fingers how much a penny is worth.



How much is a nickel is worth. (Continue with dime)

Provide each child with page 1 of the handout and coins. Help as needed. Next, introduce page 2 of the handout.



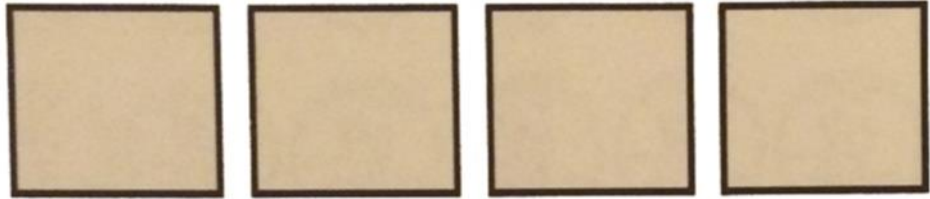
Show how to match each coin to its value.



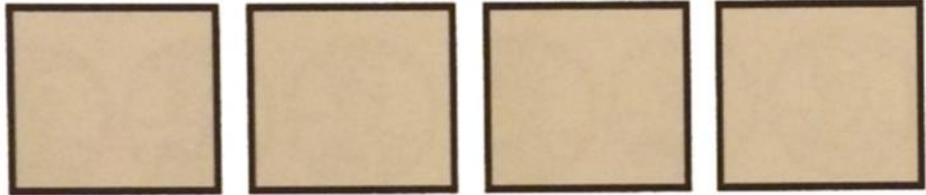
Provide each child with page 2 of the handout and coins. Help as needed.

Directions. Place the correct coin next to each value.

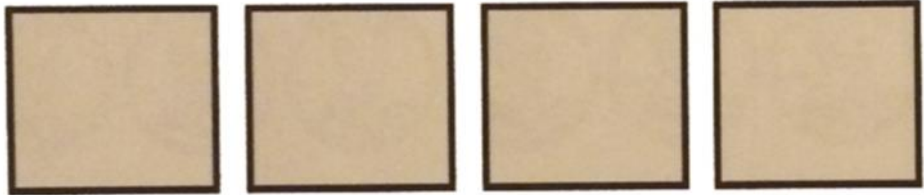

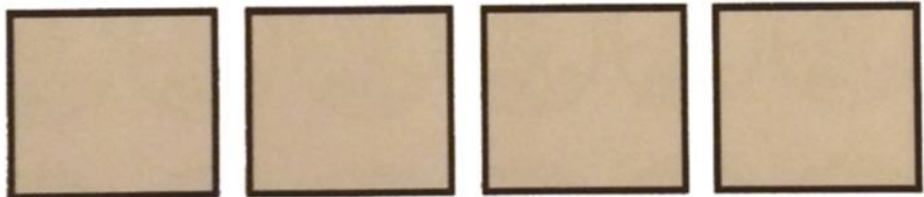
